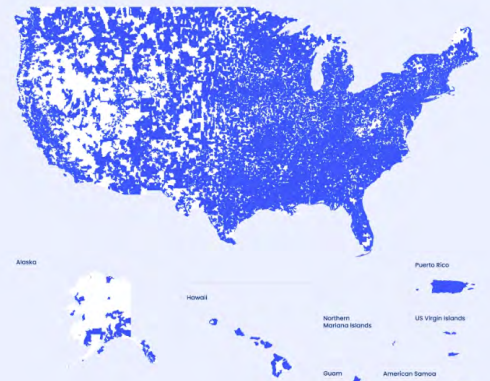
Patient Support 2024 Impact Report

Our work touched lives in over 22,000 communities and 75% of ZIP codes across the United States and its territories in 2024.



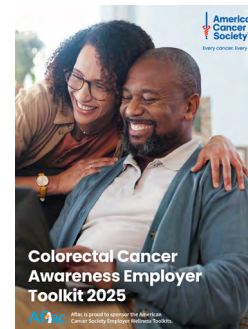
Cancer Wellness Employer Toolkits



The American Cancer Society has developed an ECHO program to address best practices in shared decision-making and high-quality treatment of advanced breast cancer. The target audience is interdisciplinary clinical care teams (clinicians, physicians, nurses, navigators, social workers, etc.). 
